Please review the following when meeting the helicopter

- Stay at least 100 feet away from the landing area/helipad. Downwash speeds can be 80+ mph.
- Wear eye and ear protection.
- Secure any loose clothing.
- Strip stretcher or gurney of all linen and pads, apply the brake and keep at least 100 feet from landing area.
- Do not approach the helicopter until one of the crew signals you or escorts you in.
- If you notice any obstructions or hazards such as open dumpsters, debris, construction material, etc., call LifeFlight to relay the info.
- If we notice any hazards in the area, we will circle and contact you through our dispatch or directly by radio.

Maintenance Guidelines for Helipads

- Avoid using any loose materials for landscaping such as wood chips, straw, etc.
- Trim any brush around the pad perimeter to < 15 inches or remove completely.
- Snow banks should be < 15 inches.
- For winter conditions, sand and salt are not to be used on the pad. Only non-chloride ice melt should be used.*
- Call LifeFlight if any construction work is being done around the pad, or if new obstacles go up on the roof.
